THE HERTSMERE BOROUGH COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, NORTH POTTERS BAR) (RESTRICTION OF WAITING) ORDER 2014

Hertsmere Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”) pursuant to arrangements made with Hertfordshire County Council (“the County Council”) under Section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000 and the Local Government (Arrangements for Discharge of Functions) (England) Regulations 2000 in exercise of the powers on the said County Council by Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as “the Act of 1984”), Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as “The Hertsmere Borough Council (Various Roads, North Potters Bar) (Restriction of waiting) Order 2014” and shall come into operation on xx xxxxx 2014
2. Save as provided in Articles 4, 5 and 6(1) of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in those lengths Roads, Potters Bar as specified in the Schedule 1 to this Order.
3. Save as provided in Articles 4,5 and 6(2) of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 1pm to 2pm, Monday to Friday in those lengths of Roads, Potters Bar as specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
4. (1) Nothing in Article 2 and 3 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by those Articles (which said lengths of road are referred to in this Article as “the restricted area”) in relation to:
 - (a) A vehicle being used for fire and rescue, ambulance or police purposes.
 - (b) Anything done with the permission of or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer appointed by Hertsmere Borough Council and as defined by the Traffic Management Act 2004.
 - (c) A vehicle which is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the drivers control or which has stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property or when required to do so by law;
 - (d) A vehicle which is stationary in order that it may be used for one or more of the purposes specified in sub-Article (2) of this Article and which cannot reasonably be used for such a purpose without stopping in the restricted area;

- (e) A marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for so long as may reasonably be necessary for postal packets to be delivered or collected;

In this Article;

The expression “universal service provider”, “provision of a universal postal service” and “postal packet” shall bear the same meanings as in the Postal Services Act 2000.

(2) The “purposes” referred to in sub-Article (1)(d) of this Article are:

- (a) Any operation involving building, demolition or excavation;
 - (b) The removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (c) The maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a road;
 - (d) Constructing, improving, maintaining or cleaning of any street furniture; or
 - (e) The laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus kept or installed for the purposes of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position.
5. Nothing in Article 2 or 3 of this Order applies to the lengths of road restricted by those Articles (which said lengths of road are referred in this Article as “the restricted area”) so as to render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait only for so long as may reasonably be necessary -
- (a) to enable goods to be loaded on or unloaded from the vehicle from or to premises adjacent to the restricted area; or
 - (b) to enable a passenger to board or alight and to load and unload any luggage.
6. (1) Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person’s vehicle which displays in the relevant position a Disabled Person’s Badge, and a Parking Disc, to wait at any time in the lengths of road specified in Schedule 1 of this Order for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle in the same length of road).
- (2) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Persons Vehicle that displays in the relevant Position a Disabled Persons Badge and Parking Disc, to wait at any time in the lengths of road specified in Schedule 2 of this Order
- (3) In this Article –
- “disabled person’s vehicle” has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;

“disabled person” means a disabled person of a description prescribed by Regulation 4 of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 SI 682;

“disabled persons badge”, “Blue Badge” have the same meaning as given in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000 SI 682;

“driver” means the person driving or having control or charge of the vehicle at any given time and in particular in relation to the vehicle.

“parking disc” has the same meaning as given in Regulation 8(5) of The Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

“Penalty Charge” shall have the meaning as a charge set by the Council in accordance with The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions(Guidelines on Levels and Charges)(England) Order 2007 and the provisions of part 6 and Schedule 9 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 and

“Relevant position” has the same meaning as given in Regulation 4 of The Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.

“vehicle” means passenger motor vehicle or motor cycle not larger than 2.30 metres in height and 5.25 metres.

7. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament:
8. Where a motor vehicle is parked in contravention of any of the Articles to this Order the driver of any such vehicle shall be issued with a penalty charge notice.
9. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by any other enactment.
10. The provisions of the following Order are hereby revoked but only in so far as they are affected by the restrictions imposed by this Order:

7	Heath Road, west side	From a point 10 metres north of the northern kerblines of Green Meadow southwards to a point 10 metres south of the southern kerblines of Green Meadow.
8	Heath Road, west side	From a point 10 metres south of the southern kerblines of Westwood Close northwards to a point 10 metres north of the northern kerb line of Westwood Close.
9	Heath Road, west side	From a point 10 metres north of the western kerb line of junction with Church Road northwards for a distance of 21 metres.
10	Heath Road, east side	From a point 10 metres north of the eastern kerb line of junction with Church Road northwards for a distance of 27metres.
11	Heath Road, east side	From a point 24 metres north of a point in line with the northern boundary of property number 14 Heath Road northwards for a distance of 26 metres
12	Heath Road, south side	From a point 12 metres east of the eastern boundary of property number 48 Heath Road eastwards for a distance of 19 metres
13	Heath Road, south side	From a point in line with the southern kerblines of Heath Road junction with Osborne Road westwards for a distance of 60 metres
14	Heath Road, north side	From a point in line with the common boundary between 61 and 63 Heath Road westwards for a distance of 27 metres
15	Heath Road, north side	From a point 1metre east of the western boundary of property number 55 Heath Road westwards to the eastern kerb line of Kerdistone Close
16	Westwood Close, both sides	From a point in line with the western kerb line of Heath Road westwards for a distance of 10 metres.
17	The Mount, both sides	From a point in line with the western kerb line of Heath Road westwards for a distance of 10 metres.
18	Green Meadow, south side	From a point in line with the western kerb line of Heath Road westwards for a distance of 10 metres.

24	Osborne Road, west side	From a point in line with the southern kerb line of Broadwater northwards for a distance of 30 metres.
25	Osborne Road, west side	From a point in line with the northern kerbline of Church Road northwards to a point 6 metres north of the northern boundary of property number 5 Osbourne Road.
26	Osborne Road, east side	From a point 10 metres north of the northern kerb line of St Michaels Way south westwards to a point in line with the northern kerbline of Church Road.
27	Osborne Road, east side	From a point 11metres north of the northern kerb line of Grangewood southwards to a point 10metres south of the southern kerbline of Grangewood.
28	Osborne Road east side	From a point in line with the Northern boundary of property number 26 Osborne Road northwards for a distance of 25 metres.
29	St Michaels Way, both sides	For its entire length.
30	Darkes Lane, west side	From a point 13 metres north of the northern kerb line of Heath Drive northwards for a distance of 130 metres.
31	Darkes Lane, east side and into Church Road south side	From a point 13 metres north of a point opposite the northern kerb line of Heath Drive northwards to a point 15 metres west of the western kerb line of Inglefield.
32	Church Road, south side	From a point 12 metres east of the eastern kerb line of Inglefield eastwards to a point 62 metres east of the eastern kerbline of Rosary Court
33	Church Road, south side	From a point 9 metres west of the western kerbline of Quakers Lane westwards for a distance of 52 metres.
34	Church Road, south side	From a point 12metres east of a point in line with the eastern kerbline of Quakers Lane eastwards for a distance of 48 metres.
35	Church Road, north side	From a point 10 metres west of the western kerbline of Heath Road westwards for a distance of 180 metres.

54	Green Meadow, north side	From a point 57 metres west of the western kerb line of Heath Road westwards to the western extremity.
55	Heath Road, east side	From a point 9 metres south of the common boundary between property numbers 46 and 48 Heath Road southwards for a distance of 26 metres.
56	Heath Road, east side	From a point 10 metres north of the northern kerb line of The Mount, northwards for a distance of 47 metres.
57	Heath Road, east side	From a point 10 metres south of the southern kerb line of The Mount, southwards to a point 37 metres north of the northern kerblines of Church Road.
