How do I report a crime?

In an emergency always dial 999.

An emergency is when there is a risk of injury to someone or a risk of serious damage to property, or you suspect a crime is in progress or there is a serious incident which needs immediate police attendance.

Hertfordshire Constabulary also has a non-emergency number 101.

When to call 101:

- If a car has been stolen
- If property has been damaged
- Where there is suspicion of drug use or dealing
- To report a minor traffic collision
- To give information about crime in an area

How do I report anti-social behaviour (ASB)?

If you would like to report anti-social behaviour please call the non-emergency number 101 or online.
