## **Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions**

### **All supplies of alcohol**

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### **Exhibition of films**

1. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
2. Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation by that body.

#### 3. Where

- (a) The film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
- (b) The relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question,

admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

4. In this section “children” means any person aged under 18; and “film classification body” means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification)

### **Door supervision**

1. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must:
  - (a) Be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
  - (b) Be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Act.
2. But nothing in subsection 1. Requires such a condition to be imposed:

(a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or  
(b) in respect of premises in relation to:

(i) Any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising films or under a gaming licence, or

(ii) Any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act.

3. For the purposes of this section:

(a) “security activity” means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and, which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act,

(b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

### **Age verification policy**

1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

2. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

(a) a holographic mark, or

(b) an ultraviolet feature.

### **Permitted price**

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1

(a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979

(b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence

(i) the holder of the premises licence.

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

**The following conditions apply where the licence or certificate authorises “on” or “on and off” sales**

### **Irresponsible drinks promotions**

1. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

2. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises:

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

3. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

### **Alcoholic drink measures**

1. The responsible person must ensure that;

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

## **Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule.**

- 1** We shall operate a strict challenge 25 policy and no unaccompanied minors (under 18) shall be allowed on the premises at any time;
- 2** Any patrons not adhering to our policies which shall be clearly visible shall be warned and banned from the premises;
- 3** Our designated premise supervisor shall be responsible for ensuring all legal and ethical policies are adhered to and the named person shall be responsible for all staff training;
- 4** CCTV shall be operational at all times and our premises shall be accessible to all relevant bodies;
- 5** The consumption of alcohol for off sale shall be in sealed containers only;
- 6** No smoking shall be allowed on the premises or outside of the premises;
- 7** Patrons shall at use designated bins as provided by Hertsmere Council
- 8** The Designated Premises Supervisor shall be responsible for adherence to the license conditions and the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 9** CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained to the satisfaction of Hertsmere Council and the police in accordance with the requirements set out in Hertsmere Borough Council's Licensing Policy;
- 10** CCTV images shall be retained for a minimum of 14 days and shall be produced on the request of the police or Hertsmere council. The CCTV system shall be operational at all times whilst the premises are trading. If the system is faulty or not working the police and Hertsmere Borough Council's must be informed immediately. Details of the malfunction shall be recorded in the premises incident book;
- 11** A4 sized warning notices shall be displayed in public areas of the premises and at all entrances advising that CCTV is in operation. The signs located at entrances shall be placed on the exterior of the building at, and adjacent to, all public access doors. All signs must comply with the requirements of the Data Protection Act 2002;
- 12** Membership of the Local Licensees Association shall be maintained and the licence holder or their representative must attend meetings and participate in all relevant initiatives;
- 13** An incident book shall be maintained within which full details of all occurrences of disorder and refused alcohol sales at the premises must be recorded. The incident book shall be kept on the premises at all times and must be made available for inspection by Hertsmere Borough Council and the police;
- 14** Authorised staff employed by Hertsmere Council / Police shall have free access to all parts of the licensed premises, at all reasonable times, for the purpose of inspection to ensure compliance with the terms and conditions of the premises licence and to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives;
- 15** We shall clearly display our health and public safety policy on the premises and on our website.
- 16** Irresponsible drinks promotions shall not be permitted, and the standards for the management of responsible drinks promotions including 'happy hours' produced by the British Beer and Pub Association shall be complied with;
- 17** The licence holder or people authorised by them shall check the premises before it opens to the public to ensure there are no risks to patrons and that all safety precautions are in place;
- 18** The licence holder shall ensure that all staff receive appropriate training about emergency and general safety precautions and procedures;

- 19** The licence holder shall ensure that all staff are aware of their social and legal obligations and their responsibilities regarding the sale of alcohol;
- 20** The telephone numbers of local taxi operators shall be prominently displayed at the premises for the benefit of customers;
- 21** All bottles and glasses and rubbish shall be removed from public areas on a regular and frequent basis and recycled accordingly;
- 22** All safety certificates and inspection reports shall be kept on site and made available for inspection by officers of relevant statutory bodies;
- 23** An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials shall be available on the premises;
- 24** A ceiling smoke alarm and Carbon Dioxide alarm and a fire blanket / extinguisher shall be fitted.
- 25** The licensee shall ensure that prominent clear and legible notices are displayed at all exits requesting customers to leave the premises and the area quietly;
- 26** Where reasonably practicable, all doors and windows shall be kept closed other than for customer access;
- 27** Patrons shall not be permitted to take drinks outside of the premises or the pavement in open containers;
- 28** No music shall be played on the premises or live sporting events be shown for the benefit of our customers;
- 29** The premises shall operate a strict "Challenge 25 policy whereby any person attempting to buy alcohol who appears to be under 25 shall be asked for photographic ID to prove their age. The recommended forms of ID that shall be accepted are passports, driving licence with a photograph, photographic military ID or proof of age cards bearing the 'PASS' mark hologram.
