Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

1. There shall be no alternation of the rules of the club relating to the sale of alcohol without the consent of the Licensing Authority.

2. All embedded restrictions and conditions inherent in the Licensing Act 1964.

3. Where a programme includes a film in the 12A, 15 or 18 category of the British Board of Film Classification, no person appearing to be under the age of 12 (and unaccompanied in that case), 15 or 18 as appropriate shall be admitted to any part of the programme; and the licence holder shall display in a conspicuous position a notice in the following terms: -

Persons under the age of (insert appropriate age) cannot be admitted to any part of the programme.

Where films of different categories form part of the same programme, the notice shall refer to the oldest age restriction. This condition does not apply to members of staff under the relevant age while on duty provided that the prior written consent of the person's parents or legal guardian has first been obtained.
