- All safety certificates and inspection reports will be kept on site and made available to officers of relevant statutory bodies;

- The premises will comply with all food safety regulations. The staff involved in food preparation will be fully trained, and their certificates will be displayed accordingly;

- Training should be mandatory;
- A record should be kept of the date and name of person trained or advised and be made available for inspection by the police or licensing authority;
- The standard practices listed above will be maintained at all the times;

The prevention of crime and disorder

- An alarm or other security measure should be installed at the premises to protect it when closed or open;
- Emergency exits should be alarmed when the premises are open to the public so that staff are immediately

notified of unauthorised opening or tampering;

- CCTV should be installed inside and outside the premises. The cameras should cover all internal areas accessible to the public and areas immediately outside the premises. The date and time settings on the system must be correct;

- The recordings should be in real time and on hard drive with the availability to copy disks for other agencies such as the police;

- Recordings should be kept for a minimum period of 31 days;

- There will be Red Care Alarm system connected to police for rapid response in situations;

- Security systems should be integrated so that the alarm, CCTV and lighting work together in an effective manner;

- Clear signage should be displayed throughout the premises about crime prevention and to warn customers of the potential for pickpockets and bag/laptop snatchers;

- A 'Challenge 25' scheme gives staff additional support and encouragement to ask for ID from any person appearing to be under 25 years of age to prove that they are over 18;

g. DPS and other key staff will be trained in the use of the CCTV system and shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public and the DPS and other key staff must be able to show or supply if requested by a Police or authorised officer;

h. No persons other than the Police, the licensing authority, the premise licensing holder or the managers/DPS shall have access to the CCTV recording equipment or the recordings made from such equipment;

j. If an incident occurs at the premises then the footage on the CCTV system shall be made available to view by

Police officers on request. If a copy is requested then it must be available within 24 hours of the request;
