Can't get out? or need to go into hospital? Need someone to look after your pet? Let us know and we'll see what we can arrange

Would you like to receive a message from a child home from school who would like to exchange postcards/letters? Get in contact

Telephone Tech Support

Want to video chat with your family through Skype or Facetime? Need to know how to set up online shopping orders? Call our friendly phone tech support volunteers to help you gain confidence with your tech

If you need help from Citizens Advice

Citizens Advice are unable to offer a face to face service at the current time but are still operating via email and over the phone.

If you are a Hertfordshire resident you can also call on 03444 111 444 or 0300 3300 650 if you are calling from a mobile. Advisers will be taking calls from 9am – 5pm Monday to Friday on this number.

Families in receipt of Free School Meals

Families who are in receipt of free school meals can attend additional sessions at Borehamwood Foodbank during the coronavirus outbreak.

The charity is offering qualifying families a lunchtime service from 11am until 1pm every Wednesday at St Teresa's Church Hall in Shenley Road while schools are closed. Cold packed lunches are available for families to take-away during the school term, while lunch packs with ingredients for hot meals will be available over the Easter break.

Other lunchtime sessions are continuing to be offered Monday from 1pm until 3.30pm and Thursday from 10am until 12.30pm for anyone else who has been referred to the foodbank by our housing support team or another local agency or charity, such as Citizens Advice, children's centres and health visitors.

Anyone attending the sessions will be asked to follow the latest strict social distancing measures and remain two metres from anyone not in their household.
