

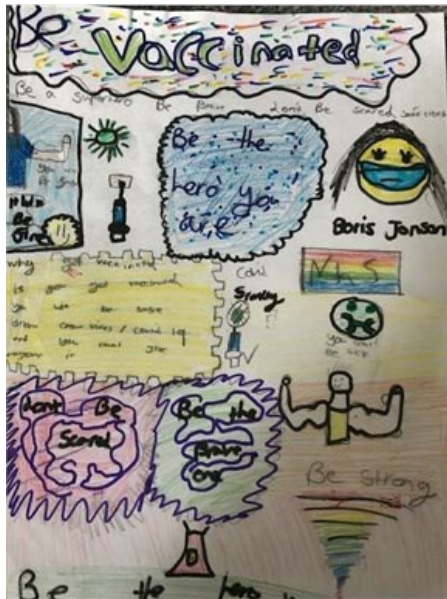


## Young people encourage residents to have the Covid-19 vaccination
