Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions.

No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence

1. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of it or,
2. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule.

There must be responsible management of the premises.

All staff must be adequately trained to ensure they are aware of the responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003, trained to prevent public nuisance,

To persons thought to be under the age of 18, I.D must be required and if not provided or in any doubt of the I.D then the service of alcohol must be refused.

Plastic glasses must be used outdoors.

There must be the provision for litterbins.

Lighting outside the premise must fully maintained and in full working order.

Risk management assessments must be checked weekly and effective, responsible management control in place at all times.

Appliances must be regularly tested and certified.

A notice must be in place requesting patrons to leave quietly.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after hearing by the licensing authority.

1. Break bar and crash bar final fire exits must be maintained and unobstructed.
2. The emergency lighting of fire exits must be of the fully maintained type.
3. Ingress and egress notwithstanding, all external doors and windows to the premises are to be kept closed during any regulated entertainment.
4. All external doors are to fitted with automatic door closers. Where an external door is served by a lobby, the door closer may be fitted to the internal lobby door.
5. Amplified music and/or speech external to the premises is not permitted.
6. Prominent, clear and legible notices are to be displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
7. The tipping of bottles into receptacles external to the premises must not take place between 19:00 hours and 09:00 hours.
8. The use of areas external to the premises for the consumption of alcohol, other refreshment or food, must cease by 23:20 Monday to Saturday and 22.50 on Sunday.
9. Ventilation ducts through external walls facing noise-sensitive properties within 100 metres must be acoustically treated.
10. All external doors are to be fitted with acoustic seals and threshold strips.
11. Loudspeakers used for regulated entertainment (other than background music) that are mounted on walls or ceilings must be acoustically isolated from the building structure.
12. Secondary or double-glazing is required for single-glazed windows facing noise-sensitive premises within 100 metres.
13. A noise-limiting device is to be used for regulated entertainment that involves amplified music and/or amplified voice. The device to be fitted and set in conjunction with, and to the satisfaction of, the Environmental Health Protection Unit.
14. Regulated entertainment shall only be provided at a pre-booked function when substantial food is provided.
15. A personal licence holder shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open between the hours of 23:00 and closing time
16. A minimum of two SIA registered door supervisors shall be provided on nights when regulated entertainment is provided.
17. A capacity for the premises shall be set in agreement with the Fire and Rescue Service, the Licensing Authority and the licensee
18. Toughened glasses only shall be used on the premises by 1 March 2007
19. No children shall be permitted in the bars during entertainment except when attending a family function.
