

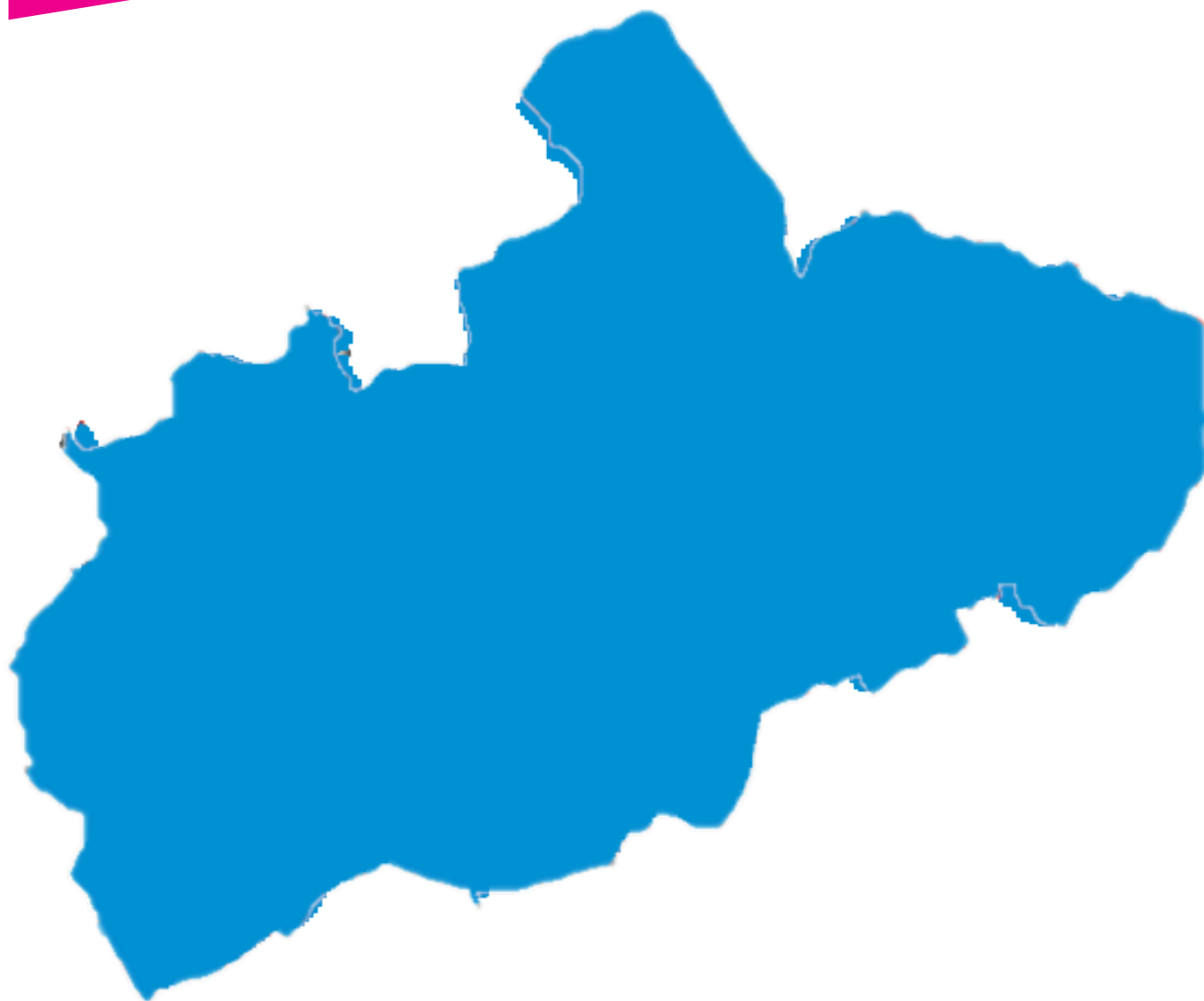

# Timetable

Due to the nature of an election, we cannot be definitive with times. However, given past experience, below is roughly how we see the evening/morning going.

Activity	Estimated time
Formal verification of ballots	Starting at 10am
Formal count starts	No later than 2pm
Final declaration of results	4pm



Postal ballot boxes arrive at the count venue and are checked by staff.

The ballot boxes from the polling stations arrive at the count venue and are checked by staff.

Ballot boxes are emptied onto tables and the empty boxes are shown to agents.

Staff count the ballot papers from each polling station.

Staff verify the number of ballot papers match the number of papers issued, as recorded on the Presiding Officers' ballot paper accounts.

The verified ballot papers are show to election and counting agents face up.

As tables finish verifying, they will move on to the count.

The Lead Deputy County Returning Officer determines the reasons for any discrepancies and produces a final verified total.

The Lead Deputy County Returning Officer produces a statement of the verification, Agents can view or copy this statement if they wish.

Staff sort ballot papers by candidate.

Staff count the number of votes cast for each candidate.

The Lead Deputy County Returning Officer will share the provisional results with the candidates and agents.

The Lead Deputy County Returning Officer will announce the results after confirmation with Hertfordshire County Council.

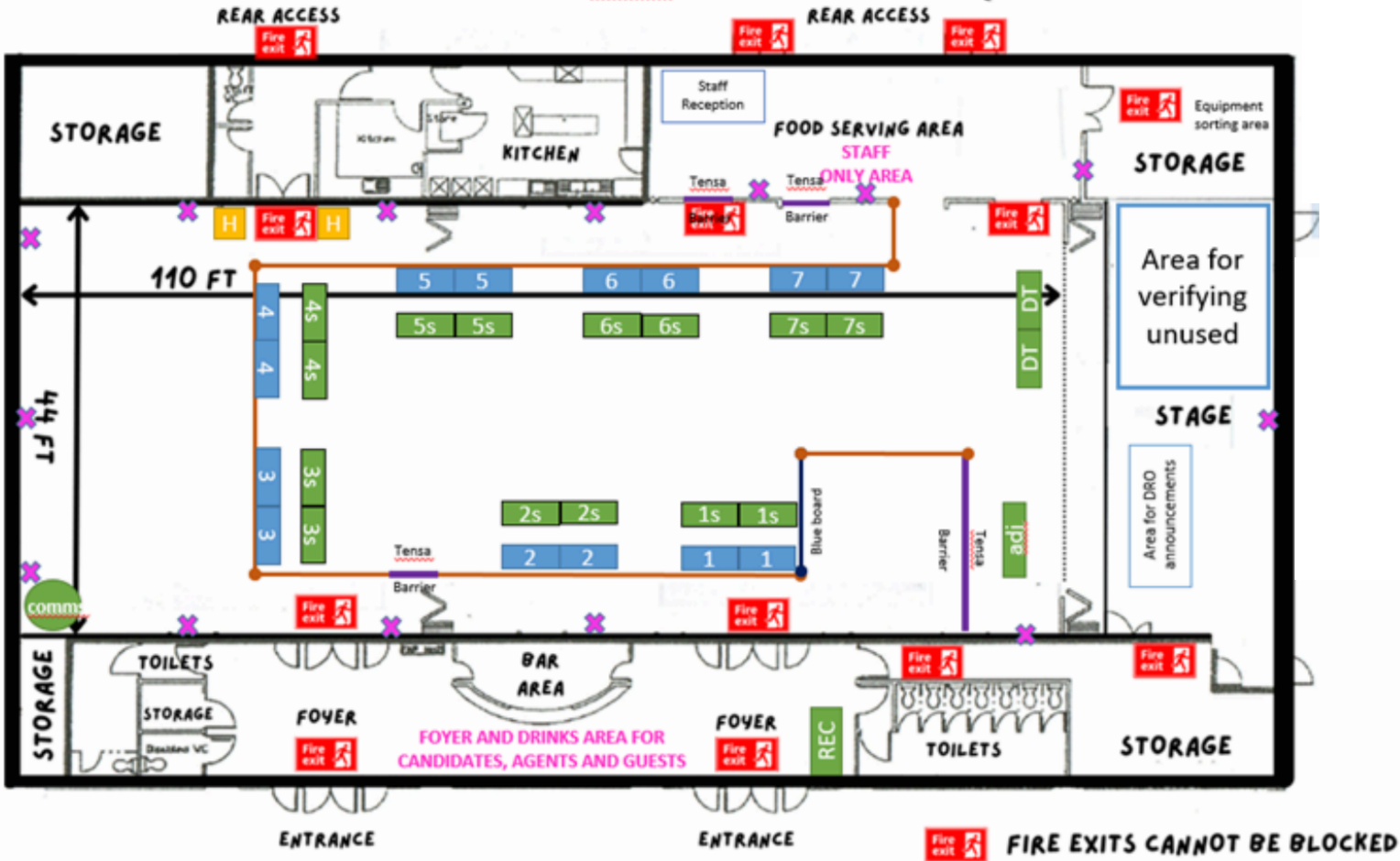
