

The walk explores Parkfields and its surroundings, taking in Allum Lane Spinney, Radlett Park Golf Course and the wider countryside.

Why Walk?

Walking is arguably the best exercise and a good way for you to get the 150 minutes of moderate exercise per week recommended by health professionals to maintain wellbeing.

How much time do you have?

40 minutes - Loop 1 (1.4 mile / 2.2km)

50 minutes - Loop 2 (1.7 miles / 2.7km)

80 minutes - Loop 3 (2.7 miles / 4.3km)

How to get there:

You can start the walk from anywhere along its route.
See walk map for linking roads.

By Road:

Parkfields is accessed over the railway via Red Road, northwest of Borehamwood. You can also join the route at Allum Lane. Borehamwood is just off the A1 or A41. There are public car parks throughout Borehamwood.

By Public Transport:

You can join the walk route at Allum Lane, a two minute walk from Elstree & Borehamwood Station. There are bus stops along the route.

Yellow arrow :

Footpath (walkers only).



Blue arrow :

Bridleway (walkers, horse riders and cyclists).



Plum arrow :

Restricted Byway (walkers, horse riders, cyclists
and horsedrawn vehicles only. No motor vehicles).

Parkfields and Allum Lane Spinney

As far back as the 17th century, hay from the meadows of Parkfields was regularly shipped into London's Haymarket to feed the horses used for pony and trap transportation in the city. The hay is still cut annually, a management regime that supports a rich mixture of grasses and wildflowers. In the summer the meadows are buzzing with bees, crickets and butterflies. Before you come out onto Allum Lane you walk through Allum Lane Spinney. This area of woodland is a beautiful sight in spring with wild garlic and bluebells carpeting the ground. You may hear great spotted woodpeckers drumming on the impressive oak trees.
